2023-24 TORONTO RAPTORS

END OF SEASON NOTES

- The **Toronto Raptors** finished the 2023-24 campaign at 25-57 (.305), including 14-27 at home and 11-30 on the road. It was just the second time in the last 12 years where Toronto finished with a home record below .500 (other: 2020-21 season where home games were played in Tampa due to COVID-19 cross-border travel restrictions). Entering this season, Toronto had gone 12 straight years without a 50-loss campaign (second longest active streak in the NBA trailing only the Miami Heat who had 15 consecutive seasons without 50 losses).
- The Raptors had a franchise record 30 different players suit up this season, topping the previous team high of 24 set during the 1997-98 campaign. Toronto's 30 different players in a season is third most in NBA history. The quartet of **Scottie Barnes**, **RJ Barrett**, **Jakob Poeltl** and **Immanuel Quickley** played just 234 minutes together across 14 games. Toronto was +65 in those minutes (Raptors' best +/- by any four-man unit) and finished 7-7 in those games.
- Toronto set a franchise record in assists this season (2335), surpassing the previous best of 2085 (2018-19). The Raptors finished tied for fifth in the NBA in assists (28.5), an improvement from last year where they finished 23rd (23.9). The last time Toronto finished in the top five in the NBA in assists was in 2008-09. Earlier this year, the Raptors had a stretch from Nov. 28 - Jan. 30 where they recorded 25+ assists in a franchise record 30 straight games, which at the time tied the 1984-85 LA Lakers for most consecutive games of 25+ assists in a single season.
- Scottie Barnes** had a stellar season for the Raptors, before his year was cut short due to an injury to the third metacarpal on his left hand. Prior to that, Barnes was named an NBA All-Star for the first time in his career, becoming the ninth player in franchise history to earn the honour (youngest since Chris Bosh in 2006). Barnes averaged 19.9 points, 8.2 rebounds and 6.1 assists through 60 games this year, the only Raptor in team history to sport those averages through 60 games in a single season. He was also just the fourth NBA player age 22-or-younger to average 19/8/6 over a 60-game span in a single season, joining Luka Doncic, Magic Johnson & Oscar Robertson.
- Toronto's 2023 first round draft pick, **Gradey Dick**, finished his rookie season on a strong note, averaging 12.5 points since All-Star break (eighth among rookies in that span). Dick led all first year players shooting .371 (53-143) from three-point range post All-Star *min 100 3PA.
- The Raptors led the league in fast break points this season (18.7). It was the sixth time in franchise history where Toronto finished the season atop that category (others: 2019-20, 2000-01, 1998-99, 1997-98, 1996-97).

- Averaged career highs in points (21.8), rebounds (6.4) and assists (4.1) in 32 games (all starts) with Toronto.
- Shot a career-best .495 (436-880) from the field this season, including .553 (272-492) with the Raptors.
- Scored 638 pts in first 30 games with Toronto. Only Raptor with more pts in first 30 games was Kawhi Leonard (819).

F - SCOTTIE BARNES #4 MIN: 34.9 REB: 8.2 AST: 6.1 STL: 1.25 TO: 2.8 BLK: 1.47 PTS: 19.9

- Sidelined for final 22 games of the season (Mar. 3 - Apr. 14) due to fracture of third metacarpal on his left hand.
- Set single season career highs in 20-point performances (34), double-doubles (25) and 3PT field goals (101).
- Recorded four triple-doubles this year, the most by a player in a single season in franchise history.

C - JAKOB POELTL #19 MIN: 26.4 REB: 8.6 AST: 2.5 STL: 0.70 TO: 1.5 BLK: 1.52 PTS: 11.1

- Missed final 21 games of the season (Mar. 5 - Apr. 14) due to a torn ligament on the fifth finger of his left hand.
- Shot team-high .656 (248-378) from the field this year; Ranked second in NBA in FG% at the time of his injury.
- Posted 20 double-doubles on the season, second most on team trailing only Scottie Barnes (25).

G - GARY TRENT JR. #33 MIN: 28.1 REB: 2.6 AST: 1.7 STL: 1.08 TO: 0.7 BLK: 0.14 PTS: 13.7

- Averaged 19.1 points in 21 games (all starts) post All-Star, averaged 11.5 points in 50 contests (20 starts) prior.
- Shot .393 (178-453) from three-point range this season, highest since his sophomore campaign (.418).
- Scored 15+ points in career-high 14 straight games; Second longest streak by a Raptor this year behind Siakam.

G - IMMANUEL QUICKLEY #5 MIN: 29.2 REB: 3.8 AST: 4.9 STL: 0.74 TO: 1.5 BLK: 0.15 PTS: 17.0

- Averaged career highs in points (18.6), assists (6.8) and rebounds (4.8) in 38 games (all starts) with Toronto.
- Shot career-best .395 (107-271) from three-point range during his time with the Raptors.
- Ranked sixth in NBA in assists since Mar. 1 (8.7); Recorded 10+ assists in a single season career-best nine games.

GAME 82 - APRIL 14, 2024 MIAMI 118, TORONTO 103

MIAMI — Thomas Bryant scored 18 points and grabbed 10 rebounds, Jaime Jaquez Jr. added 18 points and the Heat tuned up for a trip to the play-in tournament by beating the Toronto Raptors 118-103 ... Bam Adebayo and Tyler Herro each scored 17 for Miami, while Jimmy Butler scored 15, Caleb Martin 12 and Delon Wright finished with 11 points and five steals for the Heat (46-36) ... Miami goes to Philadelphia to open the play-in tournament on Wednesday, with the winner securing the No. 7 seed ... Gary Trent Jr. scored 18 points for Toronto ... Jordan Nwora and Gradey Dick each scored 14, Kelly Olynyk scored 11 and Ochai Agbaji added 10 ... Toronto finished 25-57, the fifth-worst record in franchise history ... There was some early hope; the Raptors started 8-8 and a three-game winning streak in late February pushed their record to 22-36 ... They went 3-21 the rest of the way, playing much of that final stretch without Scottie Barnes — a former rookie of the year who made his first All-Star team this year — because of injury ... It was tied after one quarter and the intrigue didn't last much longer ... Miami outscored Toronto 43-22 in the second to build a 67-46 halftime lead.

GAME 81 - APRIL 12, 2024 MIAMI 125, TORONTO 103

MIAMI — Nikola Jovic scored 22 points, Jaime Jaquez Jr. had 20 points and nine assists, and the Heat kept hope alive of escaping the play-in tournament by topping the Toronto Raptors 125-103 ... Bam Adebayo scored 19 points, Tyler Herro scored 18, and Jimmy Butler and Kevin Love each scored 14 for the Heat (45-36) ... Miami still could get out of the play-in with a win in a rematch against the Raptors on Sunday and some help ... It's the 14th time in Heat history that the team won 45 games in a season; all 13 of the previous squads made the playoffs ... RJ Barrett had 35 points and a season-high 11 rebounds for the Raptors, who lost for the 18th time in their last 20 games ... Immanuel Quickley scored 15 points, Bruce Brown scored 14 and Kelly Olynyk grabbed 11 rebounds for Toronto ... The Heat made 17 3s on Friday, and now will wait until Sunday to learn their playoff — or play-in — fate ... The Heat never trailed, building an 11-point lead after one quarter and stretching it to 19 before settling on a 66-50 lead at the half ... The lead eventually reached 25 and no Heat player logged more than 32 minutes ... It'll be Toronto's worst season since going 22-60 in 2010-11.

ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES ...

- April 7 vs. Washington marked the first time in franchise history where four Raptors recorded 20 points, five rebounds & five assists in a single game (Barrett, Olynyk, Quickley and Trent Jr.). Per Stathead, it was just the eighth time in league history where four players on the same team posted 20/5/5 statlines in a game, and first since Feb. 11, 1972.
- The Raptors set a single-season franchise record in assists this year, surpassing the previous team best of 2085 assists set during the 2018-19 campaign.
- **RJ Barrett** was acquired via trade from New York on Dec. 30 and played in his 25th game as a Raptor Mar. 5 vs. New Orleans. Barrett totalled 513 points through his first 25 contests with Toronto, the second most in franchise history trailing only Kawhi Leonard who scored 659 in his first 25 games.
- Toronto recorded 46 fast break points Feb. 22 vs. Brooklyn which marked the second most FBP in franchise history since 2000-01 (53 - Mar. 8, 2019 at NOP)
- The Raptors dished out 25+ assists in a franchise record 30 straight games (Nov. 28 - Jan. 30), averaging 30.4 over this span. Toronto's streak tied the 1984-85 LA Lakers for most consecutive games of 25+ assists in a single season.
- **Scottie Barnes** scored 20+ points in a career-high seven straight games (Dec. 23 - Jan. 5), averaging 23.4 points and shooting .465 (60-129) from the field, including .426 (23-54) from three-point range over this stretch. Barnes joined Chris Bosh (5X - last: Jan. 10 - Feb. 9, 2007) and Vince Carter (2X - last: Dec. 17-30, 1999) as one of just three Raptors to post seven straight 20-point performances at age 22 or younger.
- Toronto dished out 43 assists Dec. 27 at Washington. It marked a single-game franchise record for most assists in a road game.
- The Raptors recorded a single-game franchise record 44 assists Nov. 19 vs. Detroit. Per Elias Sports Bureau, Toronto became the first team since 1991-92 with 44-or-more assists and eight or fewer turnovers in a single game.
- The Raptors scored 142 points Nov. 19 vs. Detroit shooting .539 (55-for-102) from the field. It marked the fifth time in franchise history Toronto has scored 140+ points in a game and set a franchise-high for points at home.
- **Gradey Dick** made his NBA debut Oct. 25 becoming the fourth youngest Raptor to play in a regular season game (19 years 339 days). Only Tracy McGrady (18 years 160 days), Bruno Caboclo (19 years 61 days) and Chris Bosh (19 years 219 days) were younger when making their Raptors debut.

DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ

HEAD COACH

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007).

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid.

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate, and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their six-year-old son, Luka.
